

Day-by-Day Itinerary*:

Day 1: Arrive in Toronto, Ontario, Canada

After settling into your hotel, venture up the iconic CN Tower for a special three-course welcome dinner at 360 Restaurant. Indulge in exceptional Canadian cuisine and hospitality as you admire the revolving view of Toronto more than 1,150 feet below.

Overnight: Fairmont Royal York (D)

Day 2: Niagara Falls / Toronto / Board VIA Rail's The Canadian

Join your Orbridge Expedition Leader for a specially-guided tour of awe-inspiring Niagara Falls and the charming town of Niagara-on-the-Lake for a lunch at your leisure, often called the prettiest town in Ontario. Afterward, explore the picturesque 19th century village of Niagara-on-the-Lake before joining a relaxing wine tasting at a local winery. At Niagara Falls, enjoy a thrilling Hornblower boat ride to the base of the falls to feel the thundering roar of nature's power. Maybe partake in an optional helicopter ride to see the falls from above and revel in their beauty.

Enjoy a three-course dinner at the top of the falls while the sunsets, then transfer to Union Station to board The Canadian. Celebrate your departure from Toronto with a champagne toast and settle into your cozy Prestige Class cabin.

Overnight: The Canadian (B,D)

Day 3: VIA Rail's The Canadian

Wake to the steady sound of the rails, and open your blinds to greet the morning's lovely panoramic views. While *The Canadian* travels across Ontario, venture into the dome car to embrace the constantly changing scenery—and capture the endless photo opportunities from inside the Prestige Park lounge and dome cars. Day 4: VIA Rail's The Canadian / Winnipeg, Manitoba

Jim Warren is S. Blount Mason, Jr. Professor of English and Environmental Studies at Washington and Lee University in Lexington, Virginia. Jim is often found guiding in Alaska, where he is an experienced backpacker and mountaineer, having summited 22 of the 46 Adirondack high peaks in winter. He has traversed Canada three times by automobile, including a 125-mile trek on gravel road to Kluane Lake—using only a doughnut spare tire. He has keen interests in the natural history of boreal forests and tundra, and he has been a birder since the age of seven.

Program Accommodations:

The Canadian Railway Hotels

The Canadian Railway hotels, a group of historic hotels built between 1886 and 1930 by the Canadian Pacific and Canadian National railway companies, were designed to promote rail travel and provide modern, luxurious accommodations for passengers as they traveled across Canada. This program includes one night each in two of the most well-known, iconic hotels.

Fairmont Royal York—Toronto







Built by the Canadian Pacific Railway in 1929, it was the tallest building in Canada at the time—and featured magnificent architecture and luxury, including over 1,000 en suite guest rooms, a glass-enclosed roof garden, and a concert hall with a 50-ton pipe organ. It has recently undergone a five-year, multimillion dollar renovation to combine stunning, redesigned guest rooms with carefully preserved historic elements.

Located directly across from Union Station—and conveniently connected to the depot by an underground pedestrian walkway—this elegant downtown property is minutes away from the city's best attractions, and features five restaurants, four lounges, an indoor pool, gym, spa, and business center.

Room amenities: individual climate control, pillow top bed, flat screen HDTV, Wi-Fi (additional fee), coffee and tea maker, mini-bar, and en suite bathroom with hair dryer.

VIA Rail's The Canadian







Aboard *The Canadian* you'll experience an inviting blend of modern amenities with a sense of nostalgia, and the perfect way to unplug and enjoy nature's beauty at a slower pace.

The Canadian offers comfortable accommodations, thoughtful service, beautiful views from the domed Prestige Park car, and gourmet cuisine from onboard chefs using locally sourced ingredients.

Prestige Class provides an elegantly appointed cabin with oversized picture window with blinds, flat screen TV with video selection, modular leather L-shaped couch seating by day and comfortable double bed with luxurious bedding at night, mini-bar, and private en suite bathroom with shower and deluxe amenities. Guests in Prestige Class also enjoy priority boarding, access to the Business Lounge at Union Station, private concierge service with in-cabin cocktails and canapes, turndown service, and privileged access to the Park Car.

Please note: There is no Wi-Fi onboard the train, however, free Wi-Fi is available at these stations: Vancouver, Jasper, Edmonton, Winnipeg, and Toronto. Cellular phone service may be poor or non-existent in many areas.

Fairmont Hotel Vancouver







Opened in 1939 in a partnership between the Canadian Pacific and Canadian National Railways—and just in time for a visit by King George VI and Queen Elizabeth, this opulent gem known as the "Castle in the City," quickly became a landmark in Vancouver. The hotel has hosted many famous entertainment acts over the years, and was even home to the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation until it built its own headquarters in the 1970s. The newly-renovated hotel features distinguished restaurants and lounges, an indoor pool, gym, and spa.

Room amenities: individual climate control, pillow top bed, flat screen HDTV, Wi-Fi (additional fee), coffee and tea making facilities, mini-bar, and en suite bathroom with hair dryer.

Activity Level:

Easy

Guests should be comfortable boarding and disembarking trains without assistance, walking and moving between cars while train is in motion and navigating steep, narrow stairs to the upper level of the observation car. All hallways are narrow and have handrails, but train travel can be unpredictable and some unexpected movement may occur. At brief train stop locations, ground may be uneven and covered in loose gravel, with no sidewalks.

Optional Extension:

DAYS 7-9 IN VICTORIA





Enjoy two nights in delightful Victoria—the lush capital of British Columbia. Savor the island's relaxing pace as you explore vibrant gardens, admire historical architecture, and take in the city's friendly ambience. Visit one of Victoria's landmark castles or churches, stroll along the quaint inner harbor, or peruse the colorful shops that line bustling Government Street.

Itinerary*:

Day 7: Vancouver / Victoria, British Columbia

This morning, take an included transfer to Tsawwassen Ferry Terminal. Aboard BC Ferries, cruise the Strait of Georgia from Vancouver to Victoria—a passage providing unlimited scenery with a likelihood of spotting various marine wildlife. Upon arrival, explore world-famous Butchart Gardens and enjoy lunch on your own.

Afterward, join your local guide for a panoramic tour of Victoria through Chinatown, past the Parliament buildings, along Dallas Road, and through Beacon Hill.

The remainder of the afternoon and evening is at your leisure. Explore some of Victoria's most beautiful downtown sites, including Christ Church Cathedral, with its gothic stone architecture, magnificent stained glass windows and Hollmuth Wolff organ; Craigdarroch Castle, a stunning Victorian mansion; Bastion Square, site of the original Fort Victoria, with its stunning views of the local harbor; or the renowned Royal British Columbia and other museums that can be found in the area.

Overnight: Fairmont Empress (B)

Day 8: Victoria

Enjoy today at your leisure, exploring this charming city. From walking tours of the downtown area and its history, culture and gardens, to whale-watching cruises to explore the wildlife-filled waters off the coast, there is an endless array of ways to fill your day. Whether you prefer a relaxing day of sightseeing, carriage-riding, and perhaps English-style high tea, or more maybe visit Beacon Hill Park and stroll through some of its 200 acres—Victoria has it all. You may even choose to end the day with a locally-renowned haunted Victoria tour or a visit to one of the many craft breweries in town. Your local guide or hotel concierge can help set up a day perfect for you.

Overnight: Fairmont Empress (B)

Day 9: Depart Victoria (B)

After breakfast, guests departing during the suggested times take a complimentary transfer to Victoria International Airport for flights home.

Responsibility. Orbridge, its shareholders, directors, officers, employees and affiliates (collectively, "Orbridge"), does not own or operate any entity which is to or does provide goods or services for your trip including, for example, ownership or control over hotels or other lodging facilities, airline, vessel, bus, van or other transportation companies, local ground operators, providers or organizers of optional excursions or equipment used thereon, food service or entertainment providers, etc., even if they use the "Orbridge" name. All such persons and entities are independent contractors. As a result, Orbridge is not liable for any negligent or willful act or failure to act of any such person or entity, or of any other third party. Without limitation, Orbridge is not responsible for any injury, loss, or damage to person or property, death, delay or inconvenience in connection with the provision of any goods or services occasioned by or resulting from, but not limited to, acts of government, force majeure, acts of war or civil unrest, insurrection or revolt, strikes or other labor activities, criminal or terrorist activities of any kind, or the threat thereof, overbooking or downgrading of accommodations, structural or other defective conditions in hotels or other lodging facilities, mechanical or other failure of airplanes or other means of transportation or for any failure of any transportation mechanism to arrive or depart timely or safely, dangers associated with or bites from animals, pests or insects, marine life or vegetation of any sort, dangers incident to recreational activities such as scuba diving, snorkeling, paddle boarding, surfing, swimming, kayaking, sailing, canoeing, rafting, hiking, bicycling, rock climbing, etc., sanitation problems, food poisoning, lack of access to or quality of medical care, difficulty in evacuation in case of a medical or other emergency, illness, epidemics or the threat thereof or for any other cause beyond the direct control of Orbridge. Rates. Program rates are based on minimum participation levels, current fares (air, water, land), tariffs and currency values. While Orbridge does everything possible to maintain the listed program rates, they are subject to change effective immediately upon posting unless otherwise specified by Orbridge. In the case of invoicing errors, we reserve the right to re-invoice with the correct pricing.

Registration, Deposits and Final Payment. To confirm and secure your reservation, a deposit of \$850 per person per program and \$500 per person per extension, plus any non-refundable deposits are due at the time of registration payable by check, ACH, money order, wire transfer of same day U.S. funds, or major credit card. Final payment including any extension(s) and optional(s) is payable by check, ACH, money order, wire transfer of same day U.S. funds ONLY and due no later than 90 days prior to the scheduled program departure date. If your reservation is made fewer than 90 days prior to departure, the entire cost of the program, plus any extension and optional(s), is due at the time of registration by check, money order, ACH or wire transfer of same day U.S. funds ONLY. If final payment is not received by Orbridge at least 90 days prior to the scheduled program departure date, Orbridge may, at any time and with or without notice, cancel your reservation in its sole discretion with no right of refund.

Reservation Grace Period. Reservations (other than for the Rwanda Extension on the Tanzania Safari Migration program) made not fewer than 98 calendar days prior to the scheduled program departure date may be canceled at any time during the seven (7) calendar day period (the "Grace Period") immediately following the date of reservation for a full refund of all Payments received by Orbridge as of the effective date of termination. Notice of termination must be in writing, must be received by Orbridge in the Grace Period and is effective only on timely receipt of such written notice by Orbridge. For all other reservations and cancellations, the terms of the Cancellations and Refunds section below apply.

Cancellations and Refunds. All cancellations must be submitted to Orbridge in writing and will be subject to a cancellation fee ("Cancellation Fee") as follows: (a) if the cancellation notice is received by Orbridge 275 or more calendar days prior to the scheduled departure date, all deposits, other than for the Rwanda Extension on the Tanzania Safari Migration program, will be fully refunded; (b) if the cancellation Fee will be \$500 per person per program and \$300 per person per program for any extension other than Rwanda; (c) if the cancellation notice is received by Orbridge between 150 and 91 days prior to the scheduled departure date the Cancellation Fee will be the full deposit per person per program including any extension; (d) if the cancellation notice is received by Orbridge 90 or fewer days prior to the scheduled departure date, the Cancellation Fee will be the full program price. In addition to and not in lieu of the foregoing, a Cancellation Fee equal to 100% of the carrier charge applies to all non-refundable airfares due to your cancellation made at any time prior to the scheduled program departure date, as applicable. Refunds, if any, of any Payments in excess of the aggregate Cancellation Fee shall be processed within 30 calendar days of our receipt of your written notice.

Travel Insurance. Orbridge strongly recommends that you purchase travel and cancellation insurance to protect your investment in the event of unexpected or unforeseen circumstances. In addition, we recommend that you consider obtaining a policy(ies) that will cover some or all of your losses associated with damage or loss of luggage or personal effects. If you do not have, but are interested in purchasing, travel and cancellation insurance please contact us immediately.

Cancelled Programs. All programs are subject to cancellation by Orbridge prior to the scheduled departure date for such reasons as, but not limited to, insufficient participation, or logistical problems that, in Orbridge's sole judgment, may impede program operations or represent conditions or events that may expose program guests and/or Orbridge to undue risk of harm, injury, damage or inconvenience. In the event of program cancellation by Orbridge, Orbridge may offer you alternative arrangements such as the option to join another tour on a different date or to a different location. If the price of your alternative booking is lower than your original booking price, Orbridge will refund the difference; or Orbridge shall refund all payments made to Orbridge at the time of cancellation should the alternative arrangement not be offered or selected.

Itineraries. Accommodations, the itinerary, and arranged excursions are subject to change or substitution at any time due to unforeseen circumstances or circumstances beyond Orbridge's control. Reasonable efforts will be made to operate programs as planned, but adjustments, substitutions and changes may occur after the final itinerary has been issued. Orbridge may, in its sole discretion, withdraw a program or any part of it, make such alterations or substitutions to the itinerary or program inclusions as it deems necessary or desirable, and pass on to program participants any expenditures, additional costs or losses caused by any such adjustments, or by delays or events beyond its reasonable control.

Not Included.
